Team Application Official Team Roster Information

To participate in **any** aspect of the team competition each player must be added on the roster sheet. PLEASE be aware that no players will be added to a team roster at sign-up under any circumstances. **There will be no substitutions or exceptions.**

It is recommended that each team have more than the required number of players in their roster. A team must have at least 6 people to participate and no more than 20 people. At least 3 men and 3 women must be on your roster to participate in any aspect of competition.

Participants in the team competition must check in *before* every team competition at the designated team check-in location. Check-in times will be strictly adhered to following the official "Homecoming Clock" visible at all check in locations. Please review additional check-in information and guidelines. Students must have their **USF Student ID's (NO OTHER ID WILL BE ACCEPTED)** for all check-in times. All team members must sign the attached roster sheet agreeing to the participation agreement below. **Please attach a typed copy of your roster in addition to the one included in this packet. If a typed roster is not included with this packet your team will not be able to compete, no exceptions!**

Homecoming Competition Rules and Regulations

HOMECOMING TEAM ELIGIBILITY:

- Homecoming teams may consist of one individual organization or a group of multiple organizations. A team can not exceed three organizations.
- Teams must create a Homecoming Team name to be used during the week. Each team must make up a creative name. Vulgar or discriminating names/terms will not be permitted. The Homecoming Steering Committee has the right to determine if a team's name is within the Homecoming guidelines.
- Teams must also designate a "team captain" to serve as the official liaison for the Homecoming Steering Committee. Please make sure the team captain can attend all check-in times, turn in application, and be available during the competitions for any questions.
- All team captains will have to attend a mandatory informational meeting on Wednesday, **October 28, 2009 at 9:00 PM.** Room location will be provided via email.
- All team members must be currently enrolled as a student at USF.
- During the week of Homecoming, no team member will be given the team's point totals. **After November 23, 2009 through November 25, 2009,** if a team wishes to receive their point breakdown, they must make a request **in writing** to the Homecoming Steering Committee Executive Board. The point totals will be announced at certain events, at the discretion of the Homecoming Committee.
- Each competing team member must check-in before competing. Only those listed on the team roster will be able to participate. All participants must have their valid USF student ID to participate, **no exceptions.** **Please be advised if a team fails to check-in during the allotted time, as shown on the official "Homecoming Clock," provided on site, they WILL NOT be able to participate in the event. There will be no exceptions!** Rules and Regulations for each team competition may be found listed below by event.
- **Team rosters must have at least 3 men and 3 women to be complete.** All those participating in team competition events will be required to sign liability and waiver forms prior to each competition at check in.
- Any unsportsmanlike-like conduct **including but not limited to drunken and disorderly behavior,** or vandalism of any kind, during the week of Homecoming will result in immediate disqualification of the team or individual at the sole discretion of the Homecoming Steering Committee Executive Board, and/or the referee(s) or other officials affiliated with the University of South Florida.

Banner Competition

IMPORTANT DATES:

Banners must be turned in by 5:00 PM on Thursday, November 5, 2009 to the Office of Student Programs (MSC 2306). Judging for the banners will take place on Friday, November 6, 2009. Results will be posted on the website on Monday, November 16, 2009. The first, second, and third place banner will be on display at the Carnival on Thursday, November 19, 2009.

RULES AND GUIDELINES:

- Banners must be completed when organizations submit them to the Homecoming Committee. (Any incorrect signs will not be displayed and the organization will be disqualified.)
- Banners must be no larger than 8ft wide by 4ft tall. It is **required** that the banner be created on cloth. **This is mandatory.**
- Profanity or obscenities on the banner will result in disqualification, as determined by the Homecoming Director and Advisor. (If using the Louisville logo, please do so in good taste.)
- Any banners not complying with the above rules will be disqualified.
- The only three mandated design components are: 1) Name of the organization or team must be clearly seen and spelled out on the banner, and incorporate the Homecoming theme, "Bull-istic". 2) "Homecoming 2009" must appear somewhere on the banner at least once. 3) Any colors may be used on banners; however, Green and Gold must be the dominant colors.
- The banner must be accompanied by an index card with team name as well as a brief description of the theme of the banner.
- If your group would like their banner back after Friday, November 20, 2009, please indicate on the registration form and the BACKSIDE of the banner by writing "WOULD LIKE TO KEEP BANNER". Banners that are not requested to be kept will be thrown away after the Carnival.
- Banners will be available for pick up in the Office of Student Programs on Monday, November 23, 2009 from 9-11:30 A.M. or 4:30-5. Please make arrangements to have someone come and pick up your banner on this day.

SCORING:

JUDGING BASED UPON

- Display of school spirit - 5 points
- Overall appearance- 5 points
- Originality and Design - 10 points
- All teams that are not in the top three will receive 2 participation points in regards to the overall scoring process.

“Paint the Town” Competition

IMPORTANT DATES:

The name of the Bull’s Country Business for each team will be provided on Monday, November 9, 2009. The Bull’s Country Business must be decorated between November 14 & 15, 2009. Judging will take place on Tuesday, November 17, 2009. Results will be posted on the website on Thursday, November 19, 2009.

RULES AND GUIDELINES:

- Decorations must be completed no later than Sunday, November 15 at 4:00 PM. (Any incomplete decorations will result in the organization being disqualified.)
- All decorations will be subject to approval of the Business Owner and/or General Manager and should be contacted before Wednesday, November 11, 2009. An email is required from each team captain stating that they have confirmed approval with the business. **Failure to do so will result in disqualification.**
- Profanity or obscenities on the windows will result in disqualification, as determined by the Homecoming Director and Advisor. (If using the Louisville logo, please do so in good taste.)
- Any decorations not complying with the above rules will be disqualified.
- The only three mandated design components are: 1) Name of the organization or team must be clearly seen and spelled out, and incorporate the Homecoming theme, “Bullistic”. 2) “Homecoming 2009” along with the website-www.usfhomecoming.com- must appear somewhere at least once. 3) Any colors may be used; however, Green and Gold must be the dominant colors.
- It will be the sole responsibility of the organization(s) to return to the Bull Country Business no later than Sunday, November 22, 2009 and remove all paint and decorations. Failure to do so will result in being reported to the Student Judicial Services and the Office of Student Organizations.
- Teams are eligible to decorate more than one Bull’s Country Business but only the business specified by the Homecoming Steering Committee will be judged.
- It is the responsibility of each team to purchase its own paint. Only the washable paint supplies are to be used. Use of additional supplies will result in disqualification from the Paint the Town portion of the team competition.

SCORING:

JUDGING BASED UPON

- Display of school spirit - 5 points
- Overall appearance- 5 points
- Originality and Creativity - 10 points
- All teams that are not in the top three will receive 2 participation points in regards to the overall scoring process.

Blood Drive

RULES AND GUIDELINES:

- Any team who participates with 20 members (please see next bullet for official details of who is eligible for team's participating) donating blood will receive 5 bonus points. A daily update will be posted at the check-in stations next to the blood mobiles! Though informative, it's unofficial. Winners will be announced Friday at the Parade After Party.
- Any USF student may donate blood for credit towards a particular Homecoming team. All whole blood donations will count as one point whether they are on the team roster or recruited by a team member. All Alyx donations will count as two points since it is double red cells. Therefore, if you know you are INELIGIBLE to donate, RECRUIT people to donate towards your team. Only successful donations will count towards the competition. Just trying to donate WILL NOT give your team a point. The blood drive is 4 days, so try early in case your iron level is low or temperature is high so you can try again! Specific locations and times of donation sites will be provided at the mandatory team captain's meeting.
- **Basic Requirements for All Donors:**
 1. Have a photo I.D.
 2. Weigh at least 110 pounds.
 3. Have a good meal prior to donating (pizza, etc. will be served to donors)
 4. Not be taking antibiotics.
 5. Not have had a human bite, if it broke the skin and a tattoo in the past 12 months.
 6. Be at least 17 years of age.
 7. Be in generally good health and feeling well.
- **Requirement for Alyx Donors:**
 1. Males: Minimum height 5'3" weight 135lbs
 2. Females: Minimum height 5'5" weight 150lbs
- **DO NOT DONATE BLOOD IF:**
 1. You have an infection.
 2. You have ever tested positive for HIV.
 3. You have ever injected yourself with drugs or other substances not prescribed by a physician.
- Everyone donating will have to check-in at the table 1st and donate 2nd. (Please make sure everyone you recruit knows to check-in 1st). AFTER you donate, make sure you bring the slip of paper to the table to give your team credit or the team you are donating for.
- **You may not recruit donors within 100 ft. of the blood mobiles.** This includes signage as well as talking to the donors. Any active recruitment within this area may result in penalties as deemed necessary by the Homecoming Steering Committee Executive Board. This may include but is not limited to, point reduction or disqualification from the points accumulated from the blood drive event.
- **Darla Sechrest** is the recruiter for the USF campus and will be handling all problems at the blood drive. Please direct everyone to her if you have any questions. She is working with the Homecoming Committee and is the site contact. **She can be reached by her cell phone as well with any questions or concerns – 727-656-1200.**

Charit-A-Bull

IMPORTANT: Please do not paint the cans and remove/destroy the labels! No glitter, glue, paint, or other materials may be used inside of the Marshall Center the day of the event!

RULES AND GUIDELINES:

- Canned foods for the building of Charit-A-Bull displays must be checked-in at the Marshall Student Center Ballroom from 7:30-8:45 AM on Monday, November 16, 2009. Sign-ups for check-in times will be held at the mandatory team captain's meeting.
- Receive and complete the Charit-A-Bull Registration sheet listing all the names of team members present and the number of food items and return to the Homecoming Steering Committee at the specified team check-in time.
- **Please note:** this number is subject to verification by Center for Leadership & Civic Engagement and the judges.
- Teams must come with all food items at time of check-in. Teams are not allowed to bring additional food after check-in times, nor are they allowed to leave and buy food during the event.
- Teams will go to their assigned spot, based on the number given by Homecoming Steering Committee and can build from 9:00 AM-11:00 AM on Monday, November 16, 2009. If using the Louisville logo, please do so in good taste.
- Each team will be provided with a 6 x 8ft tarp on which to place their cans and design their structure.
- **ALL FOOD MUST STAY ON THE BLUE TARPS PROVIDED BY THE HOMECOMING STEERING COMMITTEE AT ALL TIMES.**
- Judging of the sculptures will be from 11:00 AM-12:00 PM on Monday, November 16, 2009. All team members must move away from their sculptures, so the judging will be anonymous. Two members from each team will be required to stay after judging is completed to disassemble sculptures and separate the food into different groups. Failure to do so will result in disqualification from the event.

SCORING:

JUDGING BASED UPON

- Sculptures will be judged based on creativity and numbers of cans
- Judging for creativity will include how the sculpture incorporates the Homecoming theme/USF pride, includes additional decorations, looks realistic etc.
- The creativity portion of the score is worth 50% of the total score. 75% of the sculpture has to be cans, and 25% can be decorations, and props.
- The number of cans/size of the sculpture is worth 50% of the total score. All teams that are not in the top three will receive 2 participation points toward the overall scoring process.

Knowledge-A-Bull Green and Gold Rush Edition

RULES AND GUIDELINES:

- Team check-in will be at the Alumni Association from 9:15-9:45 AM. The Competition will begin promptly at 10 A.M. on Tuesday, November 17, 2009.
- Teams must consist of 8 players: At least 3 players of each sex must be represented. (ie 3 males and 5 females)
- Participants will be clipped together by a karabiner/ rock climbing clip
- There will be 8 stations located throughout campus
- At each station there will be a question asked any team member may answer. If answered correctly one member may be released from the rope. If answered incorrectly participants will move on without releasing a member
- Questions will be USF trivia found on the USF website or Book of Bull
- At each station there will also be an activity. All participants must be present before reading the activity instructions
- Participants must get to each station by foot
- The team with the lowest time will win, and so forth
- The following actions will warrant disqualifications:
 - Unsportsmanlike behavior
 - Unclipping members and/or loosening rope before station leader allows it
 - Using any means of travel other than foot

*There will be water stations in between each station

Flag Football

RULES AND GUIDELINES:

- Team check-in will be from 5:30-6:30 PM
- The competition will be begin at 7 PM.
- Teams must consist of 6 players, 3 males and 3 females.
- Teams will play on a regulation field in a single elimination tournament.
- Games will consist of two 10 minute halves and a 3 minute half time. The team with the most points at the end of twenty minutes wins.
- Tie games will result in a sudden death.
- Regulation Co-Rec Flag Football rules apply. Rules will be provided at the mandatory team captain meeting. Rules can also be provided upon request in the Homecoming Office or through the Campus Recreation Center.
- Teams and participants that are not present at the time they are called for the competition will be disqualified.

Tug of War

RULES AND GUIDELINES:

- Team check in will be from 7:45 – 8:15 PM on Thursday, November 19th, 2009 on Sycamore and E. Holly Drive at the carnival.
- Team competition will take place during the Carnival at the “Meadow” on E. Holly Drive and Sycamore. The competition will beginning promptly at 8:30 PM.
- All teams must consist of 6 participants, 3 males and 3 females.
- All Teams are **required** to remain in the Tug of War area until there game time.
- Game time is forfeit time. NO extra time will be granted for players to arrive.
- A single elimination tournament will be used. This is for your safety to reduce risks present with event. The final will consist of the best 2 out of 3, with 2 teams advancing to the loser’s bracket competing to determine 3rd and 4th place.
- **Only tennis shoes are allowed.** No cleats of any kind will be allowed. The individual and/or team will be disqualified if cleats are worn.
- **Closed toe shoes must be worn in order to participate. The wearing of gloves will not be permitted.**
- A flag will be affixed to the center of the Tug-of-War rope. Lines will be drawn in the ground to designate opposite sides of play. The first time to pull the flag across the line on their side of the ground will be declared the winner.

Mechanical Bull Riding

RULES AND GUIDELINES:

- Team check in will be from 4:30- 5:00 PM on Monday, November 16, 2009 at the Lower Intramural fields. Participants are required to stay after check in until they compete, in the assigned waiting area.
- Team competition will take place from 5-6:00 PM before Flag Football in the Intramural Fields.
- From each competing team, only one male and one female are able to participate. Riders must have a “Go Bulls” symbol held up high above their head the entire time the bull is in motion, and time will stop when the sign or participant is dropped.
- There will be two rounds. In the first round, each participant from the same team will compete for the best time. The best time will advance to the second round. In the second round, all participants are competing for the 1st, 2nd and 3rd place. If a participant is not present when they are called for competition they will be disqualified.
- The mechanical bull attendant and a Homecoming Steering Committee representative will have final determination over time of ride.

2009 Parade Rules and Regulations

1. All participants must turn in the official entry form. All applicants are subject to review by the Homecoming Steering Committee. Those who do not turn in an application are not eligible participate. Parade applications will be received only in person. To drop it off in person please bring the application to the Marshall Student Center at the University of South Florida. Please turn it in to MSC 2306 no later than **5:00 PM on Wednesday, November 4th, 2009.**
2. A Copy of your Proof of Liability Insurance Coverage is required and must be turned in with this application. Only those vehicles listed on your application with proof of insurance will be eligible for the parade.
3. **No late applications will be accepted.**
4. The Parade Director will confirm your parade registration by telephone or email. Confirmations will be sent via email by November 10th, 2009. Those that do not receive an email confirmation have failed to submit a completed application. If this occurs please contact the Homecoming office at 813-974-5202 or Michelle D'Aquino at parade@usfhomecoming.com.
5. **All teams competing for the SuperBull Award MUST have a homemade float in order to be eligible for SuperBull Points.**
6. All entries must arrive at the staging area no later than 6:00 PM on **Friday, November 20, 2009**, and may arrive as early as 10:00 AM. **Parade entries that arrive after 6:00 PM will not be allowed to participate in the parade and will be disqualified from the competition. The parade will begin promptly at 7:00 PM.** (All official times will be determined by the "Homecoming Clock" provided on site).
7. Floats must be constructed prior to 6:00 PM on **Friday, November 20, 2009.** Construction of the floats on university property must abide by all university rules. Violators will be disqualified and reported to the University Police Department and/or Student Rights and Responsibilities. Any teams found still constructing their floats past 6:00 PM will not be eligible for points but are still able to participate in the parade.
8. Participating organizations may have no more than 12 members walking aside the float. Two members must have the sole responsibility to communicate with the driver when it is safe for them to stop and start while monitoring the safety of the parade walkers.

There can be up to 5 monitors on each side walking alongside the float/vehicle (They must **not** hand items out along the parade route). **These individuals must be clearly identified as part of the organization (t-shirt, name tag, etc).** The purpose of the remaining individuals walking is to **hand out** beads, candy, and goodies to the crowd and assist with keeping parade watchers away from the unit.

9. Due to safety, once the parade has begun, individuals may not leave his/her parade entry until the parade route has been completed.
10. All participating entries must adhere to the legal safety limit of passengers per float or vehicle.
- 11. Homecoming theme, “BULL-ISTIC” must be incorporated and seen in the float.**
- 12. Firearms, pyrotechnics, fire and fireworks are strictly PROHIBITED from any part of the parade, due to the concern for safety of all participants and audience members. Violation of this rule will result in immediate disqualification of the entry; the Homecoming Steering Committee will also notify Student Rights and Responsibilities and the University Police Department.**
13. Profanity or obscenities on the float will result in disqualification, as determined by the Homecoming Parade Director and Advisor. (If using the Louisville logo, please do so in good taste.)
14. Entries are encouraged to display the sponsoring business, organization, and/or group name.
15. The consumption of alcoholic beverages and/or the use of illegal drugs in the staging area or on the parade route **WILL NOT BE TOLERATED.** Individual and/or team will be disqualified and not able to participate in the parade. In addition, smoking is not permitted in the staging area and/or the parade route.
16. There will be no stopping at any point in the parade; however, you are requested to slow down in front of the judging area so that the judges can review your entry. All units must remain moving at all times.
17. Any individual not associated with a parade entry will not be permitted in the staging area. All performances should only occur after the parade has begun in order to be considered in the overall score for the entry. Any entry members who are at the staging

site and are not associated with your group will be asked to leave. The Homecoming Steering Committee reserves the right to request anyone to leave the staging area.

18. The first 20 USF floats to arrive at the staging area will receive one bag of beads to hand out to the crowd during the parade.
19. Parade entries are encouraged to provide additional safe items (i.e. non heavy or sharp) which can be handed out along the parade route (i.e. Beads, candy).
20. Entries are also encouraged to incorporate lights on their float to increase visibility.
21. **Floats are restricted to 13 ft in height from the ground due to potential interference with property such as power lines, trees, and tree branches. Only one vehicle may pull a float, no other vehicles may accompany the entry.**
22. All professional floats must have wheel skirts covering the wheels.
23. If you have questions or concerns they must be taken care of by 6:00 PM on Parade Day. This will allow ample time for assistance.

Float Competition

1. Floats competing in the parade competition must be constructed prior to 6:00 PM on Friday, November 20, 2009. Construction of the floats on university property must abide by all university rules.
2. Any teams found still constructing their floats past 6:00 PM will not be eligible for the competition.
3. There will be no stopping at any point in the parade; however, you are requested to slow down in front of the judging area so that the judges can review your entry. All units must remain moving at all times.
4. Only one entry per organization is eligible for the parade competition judging.
Organizations are eligible to include more than one entry but *only one* will be judged.
5. One team member walking along side the entry **MUST** carry the team competition card. This can be one of the Monitors, if necessary. Failure to do so will disqualify the team in the parade competition.
6. Entries will be judged on the following criteria:

SCORING:

JUDGING BASED UPON:

- GREEN & GOLD SPIRIT - 5 points
- Overall quality- 5 points
- Creativity - 10
- Compliance with rules/theme
